She resides in Washington, D.C. and is a parish associate at The New York Avenue Presbyterian Church, where her husband, Roger J. Gench, is the pastor.

The certificate program course, Personnel and Leadership, will be offered as an Annual Conference pre-event on November 8th - 11th.

# **What is the Compass Points Certification Program?**

This program was developed by the Presbyterian Church Camp and Conference Association in partnership with Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. It is designed for those looking to deepen their understanding of camp and conference ministry. Prospective students may be considering a call to camp and conference ministry, may be new to the field or may be seeking to widen their base of knowledge.

The certification program is comprised of eight courses of study, which are scheduled on a repeating two-year cycle. Each class covers key areas that are relevant to this unique ministry. These courses are:

- Articulating our Mission, Role and Value
- Biblical and Reformed Theological Foundations
- Program Design and Implementation
- Personnel and Leadership
- Non-Profit Business Management
- Development
- Site Administration
- Capstone Event

Faculty for the courses will include seminary staff and Presbyterian camp/conference professionals. The classes will be offered as pre-events at the PCCCA Annual Conference each fall and at Columbia Theological Seminary (in Decatur, GA) in the spring. The only exception is the Site Administration course, which is an independent internship program reviewed by a guide. Students can exempt out of a class if they have previously received sufficient course credit in a related program or can demonstrate an experience level with the course content that satisfies the requirements of the PCCCA-CTS Certification Task Force.

# **Tuition and Lodging**

The tuition cost for this certification course is \$225.00. Lodging and meals at Massanetta Springs during the pre-event will be \$218 (double occupancy) or \$254 (single occupancy) in shared bath accommodations or \$256 (double occupancy) or \$319 (single occupancy) in private bath accommodations. This cost includes lodging for three nights and nine meals (Thursday dinner through Sunday lunch). We would like to have all of the participants arrive at Massanetta Springs by 5:30pm (dinner is served at 6:00pm).

A shuttle is available from the Dulles International Airport (IAD) for \$25 one-way or \$40 round trip (either going back on Sunday or at the end of the Annual Conference). On Thursday the 8th, the shuttle will be leaving the airport at 3:00pm. Please plan your flights accordingly. If you are taking the shuttle back to the airport on Sunday the 11th, we ask that you schedule your departure no earlier than 3:30pm.



Mike also works with Gronlund/Sayther/Brunkow as a consultant to camps and congregations.

#### **Permaculture Principles for Camp and Conference Ministry Sheila Denton**

The first core tenet of permaculture is taking care of the Earth. This is the provision for all life systems to continue and multiply. This is the first principle, because without a healthy earth, humans cannot flourish. The second tenet is taking care of the people. This is provision for people to access those resources necessary for their existence. The third tenet is sharing the surplus. Healthy natural systems use outputs from each element to nourish others. We humans can do the same. By governing our own needs, we can set resources aside to further the above principles. Do these sound like solid scriptural principles to you? Come and explore a fresh lens for how we might run our camps and conference centers in light of permaculture principles.

Sheila Denton is the Executive Director of Westminster Woods Camp & Conference Center (Occidental, CA), where she has directed programs for nearly thirty years. Sheila holds a Certificate in the Art of Spiritual Direction from San Francisco Theological Seminary, and is also certified in Permaculture Design. Her ministry has focused on helping young adults find their individual callings into lives of service, and she is now a leader in developing programs that further Christian spirituality and the call to care for Creation.

# There will also be two really cool off-site trips this year:



#### **Grand Caverns**

In this part of the Shenandoah Valley, we have the **Grand Caverns** in Grottoes. This cavern is the oldest continually opened cave in North America and is a national natural landmark. The cave was discovered in the early 1800's. It is in a constant state of growth boasting many kinds of formations such as shields, cave popcorn, soda straws draperies, dog tooth spar, and more. Our geology study at Massanetta Springs will compliment this trip- putting into action the things we will learn that morning.

#### **White Oak Lavender Farm**

Another amazing and unique journey off-site will be taken to a local lavender farm about 10-15 minutes away from Massanetta Springs. White Oak Lavender Farm is a family-owned business located in Harrisonburg. The time the children and youth spend on this wonderful farm will involve a tour of their vast fields that grow over 5,000 lavender plants in over 30 varieties.



We will get to see how they harvest the lavender to extract the essential oils and dry the plants to be made into soaps, creams, and other products. The farm includes many animals such as alpacas, rabbits, sheep, goats and more that we will get to see and touch. The children and youth will also get to try their hand at making lavender soap which they will get to take home with them. The trip will conclude with a prayer walk through a labyrinth made of lavender.



# **Virginia Wineries**

In the 30 years since the cultivation of European wine grapes was introduced to Virginia, the state has become home to over 140 wineries and nearly 3,000 acres of vineyards making Virginia the 7th leading wine producing region in the United States. Our tour will take us to three Virginia Wineries - Cross Keys Vineyard located 5 miles from Massanetta Springs, and the White Hall and King Family Vineyards closer to Charlottesville. Each Winery will have a tasting (\$5 each) and dinner will follow in the city of Charlottesville. The cost for transportation will be \$10.00 per person.

# National Mall, Washington D.C.

Join us for a visit to the <u>National Mall</u> and <u>Smithsonian Museums</u> to take in some of the most iconic sites the United States has to offer. From touching war memorials to some of the world's greatest monuments, this visit truly conveys American nostalgia and pride. Transportation to the Vienna station is just \$10 per person. You can then use the <u>Metro system</u> for your own five-hour tour of the U.S. Capital before the shuttle returns to bring you back to Massanetta Springs.


# **Even More Options for Wednesday!**

# **Natural Bridge and Lexington**

Experience the **Natural Bridge** - a unique collection of natural wonder framed by the beautiful backdrop of the Blue Ridge Mountains. This national historic landmark was shaped by Mother Nature over hundreds of years from twenty stories of solid limestone rock. You will descend 34 stories and explore the deepest caverns on the east coast; and see colorful, exotic wonders in the new Butterflies at the Bridge - Virginia's largest indoor butterfly garden. A serene nature trail takes you through the great stone archway and alongside the Cedar Creek. Once owned by Thomas

Jefferson, surveyed by a young George Washington, and traversed by Civil War soldiers - the Natural Bridge is a portal to history. The bridge and caverns fees are \$11-18 for children and \$19-28 for adults. After a fun day of exploring the area, we will end our time together by dining in nearby historic Lexington. Transportation for this trip is just \$10 per person.



# Historic Staunton and the Blackfriars Playhouse

Declared by Southern Living as "the perfect place to base any exploration of the valley," **Staunton** is known for its historic architecture and it's unique shops, art galleries and restaurants. We will have time to enjoy a lovely overview of Staunton by foot or by optional trolley tour with a guide to share stories (approximately \$15). We will then have dinner at one of the **excellent restaurants**. 
