The conference is a program of the Presbyterian Church Camp and Conference Association (PCCCA).

Participants at Maintenance Connection are committed to excellence in camping and are eager to share their experiences with each other as well as gain from one another's insights.

When: Maintenance Connection will begin with dinner at 6 pm on Monday, February 1st and conclude with breakfast on Friday, February 5th.

Housing: All participants will be housed in the Agape Center (this is motel style lodging which includes linens: sheets, pillow, blanket, towel and washcloth and houses up to three people per room) or Hayden Cabin (each of the four carpeted bedrooms has 5 beds per room, its own tiled bathroom, linens will be provided).
