



Ferncliff Camp Infectious Disease Guidelines

Any person displaying signs or symptoms of illness will be referred to the camp nurse for assessment.

Any person with a fever of 100.4 or greater will be isolated from others.

- If respiratory symptoms accompany fever, isolation distance will be at a minimum of 6 feet from others.
- Fever reducing medication will be administered at the nurse's discretion with parental consent.
- Parents or guardians will be notified of the person's condition. If deemed necessary by the nurse, the parents will be required to plan to pick up the camper as soon as possible.
- The nurse will instruct parents to contact their primary care physician for further evaluation and treatment.
- The nurse will follow up with the family to determine the condition of the camper within 24 hours.

Special considerations regarding Covid - 19

If a camper presents both fever and respiratory symptoms, such as cough and shortness of breath, the nurse will also assess any recent travel by the camper and may refer the camper to the Arkansas Department of Health as appropriate.
